If you look closely there are remnants of St Nicholas of Myra in Santa Claus' red robes. But the great 4th century bishop is softened and blurred beneath a plush velvety suit and a grandfatherly twinkle. Nicholas of Myra confronted injustice, fed the poor, and witnessed to the light of faith in dark times. Even the legends that surround him –children saved from sausaging and slavery- are not about magic or myth, but the power to change lives when faith comes alive in acts of love.

St Nicholas has morphed into 'Santa Claus' in infinite and sometimes silly variations. How can we see through what society makes of 'Santa' for its own ends, to see and walk the faith of Nicholas? Pray that the church may walk in the generosity and faith of Nicholas.

As we look to the advent of Christ, let us draw near to God with willing hearts, confessing our sin before God and one other.

Silence for reflection and self-examination

We confess we are distracted, anxious and weary.

Yet we have not made time to seek your peace and light.

We have failed to do justice; we have not been Christ to one another.

We confess our sin and need to you, Lord, and we pray:

Have mercy! Open our hearts to your advent in our lives,

Strengthen us to walk in hope,

seek justice and peace for our families, our community,

and the world. Come, Lord Jesus!

In the mercy of almighty God, and by his authority, I tell you your sins are forgiven. May you know joy in the Savior's coming, in the Name of the Father, Son + and Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The Word

The first reading is from Isaiah, the 11th chapter.

There shall come forth a shoot from the stump of Jesse, and a branch from his roots shall bear fruit.

And the Spirit of the LORD shall rest upon him, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding,

the Spirit of sounced and might

the Spirit of counsel and might,

the Spirit of knowledge and the fear of the LORD, and his delight shall be in the fear of the LORD.

The wolf shall dwell with the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the young goat, and the calf and the lion and the fattened calf together and a little child shall lead them.

The cow and the bear shall graze; their young shall lie down together; and the lion shall eat straw like the ox.

The nursing child shall play over the hole of the cobra, and the weaned child shall put his hand on the adder's den. They shall not hurt or destroy in all my holy mountain; for the earth shall be full of the knowledge of the LORD as the waters cover the sea. The Word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.** (Isaiah 11:1-9)

Silence for Reflection

Psalm 145 is read responsively by verse:

I will extol you, my God and King, and bless your name forever and ever.

- ² Every day I will bless you and praise your name forever and ever.
- ³ Great is the LORD, and greatly to be praised, and his greatness is unsearchable.
- ⁴ One generation shall commend your works to another, and shall declare your mighty acts.
- ⁵ On the glorious splendor of your majesty, and on your wondrous works, I will meditate.
- ⁶ They shall speak of the might of your awesome deeds, and I will declare your greatness.
- ⁷ They shall pour forth the fame of your abundant goodness and shall sing aloud of your righteousness. **Amen.**

Silence for Reflection

The second reading is from first John, the fourth chapter.

Beloved friends, let us love each other, because love is from God, and everyone who loves is born from God and knows God. The person who doesn't love does not know God, because God is love. This is how the love of God is revealed to us: God has sent his only Son into the world so that we can live through him. This is love: it is not that we loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son as the sacrifice that deals with our sins.

Dear friends, if God loved us this way, we also ought to love each other. No one has ever seen God. If we love each other, God remains in us and his love is made perfect in us. This is how we know we remain in him and he remains in us, because he has given us a measure of his Spirit. We have seen and testify that the Father has sent the Son to be the savior of the world. **The Word of the Lord:** Thanks be to God. (1 John 4:7-14)

Alleluia, alleluia! Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight,

The glory of our God shall be revealed,

and all flesh shall see the salvation of our God. Alleluia, Alleluia!

The Holy Gospel according to Mark, the tenth chapter. Glory to you, O Lord!

³People were bringing children to Jesus so that he would bless them. But the disciples scolded them. ¹⁴ When Jesus saw this, he grew angry and said to them, "Allow the children to come to me. Don't forbid them, because God's kingdom belongs to people like these children. ¹⁵ I assure you that whoever doesn't welcome God's kingdom like a child will never enter it." ¹⁶ Then he hugged the children and blessed them. The Gospel of our Lord! **Praise to you, O Christ.** (Mark 10:13-16)

hear our prayer.

For our littlest brothers and sisters, awaiting Santa Claus. May we tell and bring alive the story of St. Nicholas, that this season of peace may point to Christ. God of peace and mercy,

hear our prayer.

For those who are sick and for those recovering from illness, for all those needs and names in our hearts today, whom we life before you now, O Lord. People of God, for what else shall we pray? *Silence* ... That they may know the healing love of Christ: Healing God, in your mercy,

hear our prayer.

O God give life to those who live in fear, whose strength is fading, who long for wholeness. Draw near to weary hearts as we pray for:

- -all in need of healing care, and those who cannot find the care they need;
- -those who are struggling to meet the needs of home and work and family;
- -all weary and stressed by trying to make ends meet, by financial fears...
- -those working in healing professions to provide hands on care, support or research...
