As we look to the advent of Christ, let us draw near to God with willing hearts, confessing our sin before God and one another.

Silence for reflection and self-examination

We confess we are distracted, anxious and weary.

Yet we have not made time to seek your peace and light.

We have failed to do justice; we have not been Christ to one another.

We confess our sin and need to you, Lord, and we pray:

Have mercy! Open our hearts to your advent in our lives,

Strengthen us to walk in hope,

seek justice and peace for our families, our community,

and the world. Come, Lord Jesus!

In the mercy of almighty God, and by his authority, I tell you your sins are forgiven. May you know joy in the Savior's coming, in the Name of the Father, Son + and Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

HYMN

Let us pray. *Silence* We praise you, O God, for this evergreen crown that marks our days of preparation for Christ's coming. The Word

The first reading is from Isaiah, the seventh chapter.

¹⁰The LORD spoke to Ahaz, saying, ¹¹Ask a sign of the LORD your God; let it be deep as Sheol or high as heaven. ¹²But Ahaz said, I will not ask, and I will not put the LORD to the test. ¹³Then Isaiah said: "Hear then, O house of David! Is it too little for you to weary mortals, that you weary my God also? ¹⁴Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Look, the young woman is with child and shall bear a son, and shall name him Immanuel. ¹⁵He shall eat curds and honey by the time he knows how to refuse the evil and choose the good. ¹⁶For before the child knows how to refuse the evil and choose the good, the land before whose two kings you are in dread will be deserted." The Word of the Lord **Thanks be to God!** (Isaiah 7:10-16)

Silence for Reflection

The Magnificat is read responsively by verse:

^{46b}My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, ⁴⁷my spirit rejoices in God my Savior,

⁴⁸for you, Lord, have looked with favor on your lowly servant.

⁴⁸for you, Lord, have looked with favor on your lowly servant From this day all generations will call me blessed:

⁴⁹you, the Almighty, have done great things for me and holy is your name.

⁵⁰You have mercy on those who fear you, from generation to generation.

⁵¹You have shown strength with your arm and scattered the proud in their conceit,

⁵²casting down the mighty from their thrones and lifting up the lowly.

⁵³You have filled the hungry with good things and sent the rich away empty.

⁵⁴You have come to the aid of your servant Israel, to remember the promise of mercy,

⁵⁵the promise made to our forebears, to Abraham and his children forever.

Silence for Reflection

The second reading is from 1st Thessalonians, the fifth chapter.

¹⁶Rejoice always, ¹⁷pray without ceasing, ¹⁸give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. ¹⁹Do not quench the Spirit. ²⁰Do not despise the words of prophets, ²¹but test everything; hold fast to what is good; ²²abstain from every form of evil.

²³May the God of peace himself sanctify you entirely; and may your spirit and soul and body be kept sound and blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. ²⁴The one who calls you is faithful, and he will do this. The Word of the Lord: **Thanks be to God.** (1 Thessalonians 5:16-24)

Silence for Reflection

Alleluia, alleluia! Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight,

The glory of our God shall be revealed,

and all flesh shall see the salvation of our God. Alleluia, Alleluia!

The Holy Gospel according to Luke, the first chapter. Glory to you, O Lord!

²⁶In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, ²⁷to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. ²⁸And he came to her and said, "Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you." ²⁹But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. ³⁰The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. ³¹And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. ³²He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. ³³He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." ³⁴Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I am a virgin?" ³⁵The angel said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God. ³⁶And now, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son; and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren. ³⁷For nothing will be impossible with God." ³⁸Then Mary said, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word." Then the angel departed from her. The Gospel of our Lord! **Praise to you, O Christ**.
